SCC in Context

- Approved the establishment of SCC in the SCF AGM 2015
- Sinhalese Cultural Centre Limited Not-for-Profit company registered on 22nd Dec 2015
- First Board of Directors appointed in the SGM held on 13th March 2016
- Key Objectives of SCC
 - Provide a permanent place where Sinhalese cultural activities can be conducted
 - Raise and source funds, acquire land, design and construct the Sinhalese Cultural Centre
 - Manage and operate the Sinhalese Cultural Centre
 - Preserve, hold, and keep safe items of Sinhalese cultural heritage
 - Provide performance space and facilities to allow promotion of cultural performances activities including music, drama, dance and literacy

SCF & SCC Structure & Relationship

- The sole member of the SCC is SCF, represented by the SCF membership
- The President and another nominated member of the SCF Executive committee are directors of SCC by default
- The SCC board members are elected by the SCF members at the AGM of the SCF

Cultural Centre Establishment Planning

- Short Term Plan Lease a facility such as a Community Centre to establish the Cultural Center for short term use


Short Term Plan

- Leasing option, such as a community centre
- Had detailed discussions with Hornsby Council, however, due to various constraints and policies within the council, a favourable outcome hasn't been possible so far
- Commercial leasing is not considered as very viable



SCC Property Purchase Proposal

- Many options analysed, explored and initiated
- Proposed and pursued an Investor/Contributor proposal to acquire a property
 - Good response
 - Due to legal reasons and associated risks, the SCC decided not to proceed
 - Decided to progress with a completely Not-for-profit path to acquire a property
- Initiated a two-stage approach



- The approach to the two-stage process, in summary are as follows.
 - Purchase a low value property (e.g. value: \$700k, 600-800 Sqm land with an old house in a low cost suburban area, at a viable location)
 - Establish the Cultural Centre and operate for few years in lower scale
 - Pay-off the mortgage and generate the equity
 - Purchase the property we finally need



SCC Property Purchase Proposal ...

- JanaShakthi program is vital for this to be successful:
 - Launched in March 2018
 - Minimum \$1000 Contributions
 - Pay in full or installments flexible
 - Raised \$10k but there is a long way to go
- SCC needs to prove the ability to service a loan
- While there are ways to meet this requirement, fundamental need is:
 - Annual income of \$200,000 (in 2017/2018 we were at \$52,000) => achievable!
 - Annual Surplus of \$60,000 (in 2017/2018 we were at \$32,000) => achievable!
- As preparation to Stage 1, the SCC is seeking the members approval to acquire a property for the
 establishment of the Sinhalese Cultural Centre, with a purchase price not exceeding one (1) million
 dollars, in accordance with the section 24(c) of the SCC Constitution

Fund Raising and Community Engagement Activities – SCC Raffle - 2017



- Tickets released in September 2017 (\$20 each or 3 for \$50)
- Excellent support from the community!
- Raffle draw was held on 18th November
 @ Madhura Rathriya event at Cherrybrook CC
- Sold in excess of \$15,600 worth of tickets
- Net profit from the raffle was in excess of \$10,800
- Expect to hold bi-annually







- Annual fundraising dinner 2nd time
- Held on 24th March at Roselea Community Centre
- 230 distinguished guests
- Guest of Honour was Hornsby Council Mayor Honourable Philip Ruddock
- What did we achieve:
 - Created the much-needed community awareness about the Sinhalese Cultural Centre
 - Raised the SCC profile among the Local Government Officials
 - Raised a net profit of over \$5400
 - Enhanced the community bonding and everyone enjoyed
 - Represented by many community organisations
- Expect to host next year's event with a renewed concept to improve the outcomes of the event










- Screened the popular Sinhala film "Bimba Devi alias Yashodhara" in July-September 2018, at Event Cinemas (Vmax), Castle Hill
- Screened on 22nd July and 02nd September 2018
- Both Screenings Sold Out (300 +300)
- Raised net profit in excess of \$6000
- Film was distributed by Lanka Events (Yasiru Multimedia Pty Ltd) throughout Australia and the SCC would like to thank Mr Kithsiri Karunaratne – Managing Director of Yasiru Multimedia for providing this opportunity to SCC!

Lanka Cuisine – Spring 2018

- Hosted on 13th October 2018 at Roselea Community Centre
- Objective was to promote Sri Lankan food to the many communities and to raise funds for the SCC
- Planned to host the event with Sri Lankan Chefs however had implementation issues
- Number of other social events were held on the same day and in the weekend which were not published at the time SCC was deciding on the day
- Planned for 300-350 guests, however the SCC only managed to attract around 200 guests
- Expect to deliver a moderate loss of around \$500
